How to get here

Location: Stone Circle at Ham Hill Country Park, Stoke-sub-Hamdon, TA14 6RW

What3words: ///villas.firm.mixes

By Bus

There are none that run to the top of the Hill, but bus number 81 from Yeovil to Ham Hill is every 3 hours and links to other villages.

By Car

There is free parking available at Ham Hill, just follow the directions on site.

Disabled parking spaces

There are approximately 15 disabled access spaces, however only one of these is marked out. Pre-booking is not available but disabled access parking and drop off point will be signposted.

From the parking area there is a flat gravel pathway, suitable for wheelchairs and pushchairs.

Accessible toilet facilities

Toilets, which include disabled access, are available at the event space.

Public toilet facilities

Toilets are also available at the Rangers Centre

Refreshments

The Prince of Wales pub is on site and serves hot and cold drinks, as well as meals and snacks. Other refreshments may be available on the day.

Bring your own picnic

Visitors may bring their own picnic on this site.

Drinking water refill point

You can refill your drinking water bottles at the event space and at the Rangers Centre (What3words: ///intent.amaze.pitchers)

Quiet area

The site itself is a wide, open space with lots of room to spread out.

Enjoying the show

The display/performance area is open and unfenced.

Bring rugs, cushions or lightweight folding chairs for comfort.

This will be a British Sign Language interpreted show, space for those needing to see the interpreter will be set aside, please ask when you arrive.

Good to know

Ham Hill Country Park has one on-site tramper which is available to hire. To enquire about availability or book please call 01935 823617.

There is a working quarry adjacent to the site, this is fenced but all children should be supervised.
